LWVIN WOMEN'S HEALTH/REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS ADVOCATES UPDATE 2023


The Indiana Supreme Court held a hearing on the case *Members of the Medical Licensing Board of Indiana, et al. v. Planned Parenthood Great Northwest, Hawai'i, Alaska, Indiana, Kentucky, Inc., et al.* on January 19 at 9 am ET. You can watch the video at <u>https://mycourts.in.gov/arguments/</u> (allow at least 2 hours after the hearing ended at 10 am.) The primary issue in this case concerns the Right to Privacy.

After vigorous testimony from both Ken Falk of the ACLU and Tom Fisher, IN Deputy Attorney General, and incisive questions from the 5 Judges, **Supreme Court Chief Justice Loretta Rush said that an "opinion will be issued in due course."** Until then abortions in Indiana will continue as specified by Indiana law **before** the special session. Two other Court cases dealing with religious freedom have also been filed and heard by local courts. The Indiana Supreme Court hasn't indicated how it will deal with those.

In the meantime, we are following a variety of bills related to women's health, reproductive rights, contraceptives, equal pay, family and medical leave, and support for pregnant women and their babies. The list is below. We want to see action on the **pharmacy prescribed birth control pills**. It IS interesting that **SB 153 (pharmacist prescribed birth control) was sponsored by Republican Ed Charbonneau,** chairman of the Health and Provider Services Committee. **HB 1066 (Sexual health education)** sponsored by Errington and Pfaff is another bill of interest.
