Promotion ideas

- Social media with graphics and hashtags
 - Develop your own specific hashtags for your League
 - Encourage League members to share and like posts
 - Encourage partner organizations to share
- Voter fact sheet to post around town as a flyer and as a PDF on social media.
 - Also partnered with the mayor's office to have it printed in color and inserted into utility bills.
- Write editorial about Vote411 for your local newspaper and call into local radio shows.
- Hand out small cards with instructions for using Vote411.

 - Note: Hashtags help your content enter into larger conversations and garner visibility. Hashtags are most successful on Twitter, and should be used sparingly on Facebook. You should use the hashtag #2020Election—and please consider tagging @LWV, @LWVEdFund, and/or @VOTE411!
 - You should also use local hashtags specific to your state or community's elections. For example, #FlaPol or #CAvote. Look on Twitter to see what other folks in your state or area are using!

Countdown to the Election

Are you Registered to Vote?

- Register to vote: in the Voter Registration Office, second floor, Putnam County Courthouse; call 765-655-1538, or online: <u>https://indianavoters.in.gov/</u> until Oct. 5, 2020.
- Confirm your voter registration: <u>https://indianavoters.in.gov/</u>

Ways you can vote:

- Absentee voting by mail; request a ballot online: <u>www.in.gov/sos/elections/</u> Email: voterregistration.putnam@airhop.com or call 765-655-1538 request must be received by October 22, 2020. Confirm the status of your absentee ballot: Email: voterregistration.putnam@airhop.com or call 765-655-1538.
- Absentee, (Early) In Person voting: On the second floor of the Putnam County Courthouse, Greencastle, Indiana, beginning October 6, 2020.
- Election Day: Vote at one of eight (8) voting centers in Putnam County on November 3, 2020. (See below)

Saturday, September 19, 2020

 DEADLINE for county election board to mail absentee ballots to voters who have already filed an approved application with Voter Registration Office.

Monday, October 5, 2020 VOTER REGISTRATION ENDS

Tuesday, October 6, 2020 - Nov. 2, 2020

- First day to cast an Absentee (Early) vote in Person: second floor, Putnam County Courthouse- 8:00 a.m.to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Saturday, October 24th and October 31^{st.}
- A voter must provide a government-issued photo ID before casting a ballot in-person.

Thursday, October 22, 2020

 DEADLINE, by 11:59 p.m., for the Voter Registration Office to <u>receive</u> an absentee ballot application from an applicant requesting delivery of a ballot by mail. Applications may be submitted to the Voter Registration Office; second floor, Putnam County Courthouse, in person or by mail, fax or email. (See above)

Tuesday, November 3, 2020 GENERAL ELECTION DAY

Deadline at noon for the voter registration office to receive absentee-by-mail ballots.

Polls are open 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., local time.

- A voter must provide a government-issued photo ID before casting a ballot in-person.

Tuesday, November 17, 2020

DEADLINE, by noon, for a candidate to file a verified recount or contest petition.
